There she was an active member of the Dnipro Chorus and worked tirelessly to obtain official historical designation of her family's home church – St. Mary's Ukrainian Orthodox Church in Szypenitz, Alberta. Greg grew up in Wadena, Saskatchewan and moved to Saskatoon for his university education. There he was introduced to Ukrainian Choral singing in the Cathedral church choir and Lastiwka folk choir which sowed the seeds for his lifelong involvement with choirs and eventual Hetman award in 2018.

Fate and good luck brought them both to Calgary where they met, married, and raised two girls – Larissa and Lykera.

Together, Lori and Greg are actively involved at St. Vladimir's Ukrainian Orthodox church in a variety of capacities and remain engaged in the broader Calgary-Ukrainian community. The recent influx of Ukrainian evacuees to Calgary has given them both many new responsibilities – welcoming these newcomers with open arms, assisting them with settling into their new lives and guiding them about life in Calgary and Canada. Lori continues to dedicate a lot of her time to assisting at the centre in St. Vladimir's run by the Ukrainian Humanitarian Aid Committee (UHAC). She is also very actively involved with raising money for the Children's Essential Committee (CEC) and providing newly arriving children with basic necessities.

Lori and Greg recently began hosting a family from Ukraine in their home – helping them navigate life in Canada and in turn improving our ability to speak Ukrainian. There is a real need for this type of transition to life in Canada and they encourage others to do this if they have the means.

Festivals like the Calgary Ukrainian Festival play a pivotal role in maintaining our colourful Ukrainian traditions, language, music, arts and folklore. It has allowed our culture to flourish in the freedom that Canada provides – preserving traditions brought by each of the waves of Ukrainian immigrants starting as far back as the late 1800's and early 1900's when our families arrived – and integrating them with the newer traditions brought by the recent wave of arrivals over this past year.



A TRIBUTE TO RON CAHUTE BY NEW PATHWAY

Ronald "Ron" Cahute – known by his Ukrainian name Roman – a Ukrainian Canadian accordion legend and recording musician, composer and producer who released over 30 albums either as a solo artist or with the band Burya, died on April 22 in Toronto. He was 68.

Mr. Cahute, a prolific performer who took worked on 178 albums as a guest musician, had collaborated on recording projects with Nana Mouskouri, Sofia Rotaru, Lisa Dalbello, Melissa Manchester and Catherine McKin-non, among many others.

Born in Toronto on March 26, 1955, his music career began in 1962 as a drummer in the band of his late father, Maurice Cahute. In 1969, Ron Cahute founded a Ukrainian band that would later be called Burya (storm in Ukrainian).

Additionally, Mr. Cahute took time to record a Ukrainian comedy album in 1997 with Ihor Baczynskyj, which was titled "And the Garden Goes Here!" as well as a series of children's educational albums (1997-2000), among them were "Barabolya," "Tsybulya," "Booryak and Carrots Too," "Borscht" and "Barabolya High." Sharing his talents with the Ukrainian community in Canada, Mr. Cahute had a regular feature, "Stay Ukrainian My Friends," on the popular Kontakt Ukrainian television program that featured cultural and personal stories from Ukrainians being Ukrainian.

Mr. Cahute was a recipient in 2019 of the Taras Shevchenko Medal, the highest honor bestowed by the UCC.

Mr. Cahute leaves behind his wife, Binka Cahute, and daughters Krystie (with husband Chris) Piers, Amanda Cahute, Jenny Cahute and Katrina (with husband Andrew Makarenko). Mr. Cahute was known as "Gigi Ron" to grandchildren Zacharias, Jeremiah, Alivia, Sophia, Grayson and Jeremy, and he was known as "Dido Ron" to grandchildren Alex, Julia, Milana and Yana, and he was known as "Unc" to his nephews Mark Zubek and Kevin Zubek.

This ceremony begins at the home of the girl's parents. Matchmakers called the "starosty" arrive with a traditional bread and ask consent. If consent is not given...a pumpkin is returned instead!

THE BLESSING

The bride's hair is unplaited symbolizing the end of her life as a maiden girl. She is dressed in her wedding attire and receives her wedding gift from her groom to be. The couple receives a special blessing from their parents.

THE ENGAGEMENT

A ceremony of songs performed by friends and mothers of the bride and groom prepare the bride's wedding crown made of barveenok. The wedding evergreen tree and wedding bread arrive!

THE WEDDING RECEPTION

Let the festivities begin Guests arrive and toasts to the bride and the groom are exchanged in traditional ceremonial rite. The first kiss is exchanged and the wedding party dances for joy!

Hello! I'm Kristina Tarasenko a designer and illustrator that loves to create fun and exciting works of art (especially ones with doodles all over).





The Calgary Hopak Ensemble Senior Dancers is our adult dancers and prides themselves in presenting diversity of dances from different regions of Ukraine and surrounding areas. Some of our dancers have taken part in dance seminars in Ukraine and in Canada. The Calgary Hopak Ensemble Orchestra consists of talented musicians that have been with us for as recently as 2 years to 45 years. The orchestra plays for all performances that are held throughout the cultural season. The Calgary Hopak Ensemble Choir repertoire consists of Ukrainian and English songs and are accompanied by our Ensemble Orchestra. We are proud to boast that participants include fourth and fifth generation Canadians of Ukrainian descent, as well as members of other ethnic backgrounds. Our concerts are held at community facilities throughout the city with two major performances a year. We maintain an active Ukrainian Senior Citizens' Club. The Calgary Hopak Ensemble is committed to the promotion of Ukrainian Culture in Canada and to helpCanadians of Ukrainian descent keep their Ukrainian heritage alive.

IVAN KHARLAMOV

PIANIST, COMPOSER, AND IMPROVISER Ukraine Ivan Kharlamov is a professional pianist, composer, improviser, and arranger from Ukraine. He started his musical path in early childhood, beginning to play the piano at the age of 4. He started studying piano and violin in a music school at an early age and for over 9 years.

He realized his passion and talent for jazz music and pursuit of improvement, starting to perfect his skills professionally, entering the College of the Luhansk State Academy with a jazz piano specialization. Afterward successively starting to study at Luhansk State Academy, shortly thereafter joining the teaching staff, already being qualified as a highly-skilled jazz pianist and piano teacher. During his training at the Academy, he was acquiring more skills by participating in various jam sessions and masterclasses. Afterward successfully graduated from Luhansk State Academy of Culture and Arts with honours, obtaining a master's degree in Music, and remaining to be a professor at the higher educational institution.

Ivan is a laureate of various international competitions and festivals. In 2010 he was a winner of the III prize in the Donetsk youth jazz competition of young performers, held in the city of Donetsk, Ukraine. In 2013 has was a laureate of the II. prize of the American International Jazz Festival-competition of young improvisers named after D. Tyomkin, which took place in Kremenchuk, Ukraine. In 2013 he participated in the All-Ukrainian Youth Delphi Games, in Kyiv city. In 2020 he was registered at the records, for playing the longest piano performance of the National Anthem of Ukraine with its rock interpretation.

In January 2023 Ivan is a laureate with two Grand Prix of the Ukrainian International Christmas Festival, in the categories of piano performance, and audiovisual art.

Since the beginning of his musical career, he was collaborating with famous artists and musicians from all over Ukraine and worldwide, such as Andriy Kondakov (piano), Milan Tsonich (Serbia, vocals), Stefan Pavlovsky

Since 2013 Ivan proved himself as a successful entrepreneur, he founded the audio and video recording studio "H&F Production" (Luhansk, Ukraine), as well as he owned his original Music School "Allegro" (Irpin, Ukraine), where Ivan kept sharing his musical talent and skills with students in his special unique and entertaining way.

From 2019 to 2022 he was a leader of the Kyiv Theater named after Vladimir Vysotskyi.

His repertoire is impressively wide-ranging and encompasses various music genres. His improvisation skills and performance are emphasized as a brilliant and outstanding work of art. As a teacher, Ivan is very open and friendly, so far as this is his personality as well! UKRAINIAN FOLK ENSEMBLE Calgary, AB



The choir created a scale project "Stefaniia". The project is the result of the big inspirational movement in the community in March-May 2-2, when Ukraine won a Grand prize of the Eurovizion music festival.

Kateryna and the team of creators brought a variety of professional and nationalities, people of different paths of life together to make this impactful project. The project was videotaped in a beautiful backyard on one of the Calgarian residences. The videographers, dancers, musicians and members of the community gathered together to create this scale project.

"Pereveslo" also became an active participant in Calgary Carole festival. Trying to bring this native Ukrainian tradition to a lot of Calgariens during Christmas.

Throughout its short history "Pereveslo" became a community, a family for people who became displaced and mourned the loss of their community, the centre of cultural gatherings that carefully preserves national traditions and rituals.

The choir members call themselves "Perevesliany" - in Ukrainian translation it means-"those who belongs to "Pereveslo". the feeling of belonging, love, that helps to survive in new place, feeling of family and homeland so far from home - that what this choir is to its members!

Polanie" Polish Song & Dance Association was founded in Calgary, in 1977, under the initiative of Siostra Alojza. Since its onset, the ensemble has developed and established
